

EYFS/KS1

Our topic this half term in Year 2 is 'Unsinkable'. We are learning about the Titanic, what happened to it and the impact that it has had on transportation today.





NEW YOUTH CLUB



ITCHY HEADS

We seem to have some itchy heads in School and Reports of Headlice.

As in all primary schools, eradicating head lice is an ongoing problem.

If we all 'PEEK ONCE A WEEK', we can work together to stop the spread of itchy heads:

- 1. Wet and liberally apply conditioner to your child's hair.
- 2. Use a head lice comb and comb carefully.
- 3. If lice are found you can treat with a branded product, or wet comb your child's hair every three days until the lice and eggs have been removed.
