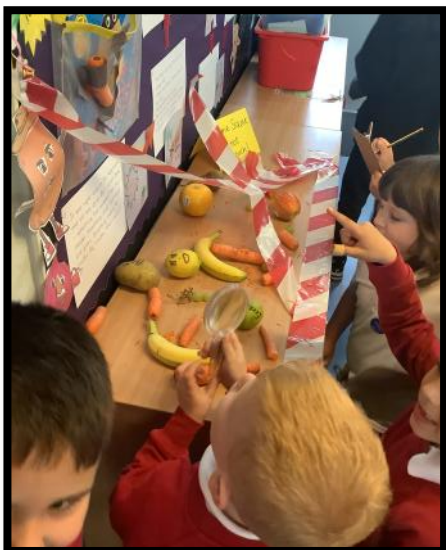
We couldn't be prouder of the class of 2025 — well done, Year 6!

## EYFS/KS1

Year 1 have been thoroughly enjoying our 'Hero Hunters' topic. We have been reading 'Supertato' and created our own superhero vegetables on our Immersion day. We had to investigate a crime scene when we discovered someone had terrorised some vegetables one morning! We asked questions and used magnifying glasses on our way around the school, until we discovered the culprit – it was the Evil Pea, just as we had suspected! We will be creating a new villainous vegetable and writing a new Supertato adventure before the end of term.

In maths we have been counting in 2s, 5s

and 10s and beginning to share numbers equally into groups to start our learning about multiplication and division. We have been learning about directions and compass points in Geography and know a catchy song to help us to remember them. In Art, we have used our drawing skills to invent a new superhero and designed their logo.

Well done Year 1, we have worked so hard this term!



## KS2 Lower

During Summer 1, the children in year 4 having been comparing urban and rural lifestyles. We took inspiration from the fable 'Town Mouse and Country Mouse' and wrote our own travel blogs to embark on adventurous journeys.

In Geography, we have been enhancing our fieldwork skills and use a compass to locate different reference points on the school ground using cardinal points.

In Art, we have just begun studying the work of Charles Mackintosh and his architectural design of stained glass

windows with the famous Mackintosh Rose. Next week, we are excited to visit the Xscape to experience urban architecture and lifestyle!



## KS2 Upper

This term Year 6 have been investigating electricity. We have studied electrical circuits and troubleshooting circuits that do not work. In addition we have found out how to make circuits with lights and buzzers, dimmer or louder by changing components. We have also been revising tirelessly ahead of the KS2 SATs - a week which went smoothly and hopefully successfully. Children have also shown their creative and theatrical skills by auditioning for our Summer play: Grease.

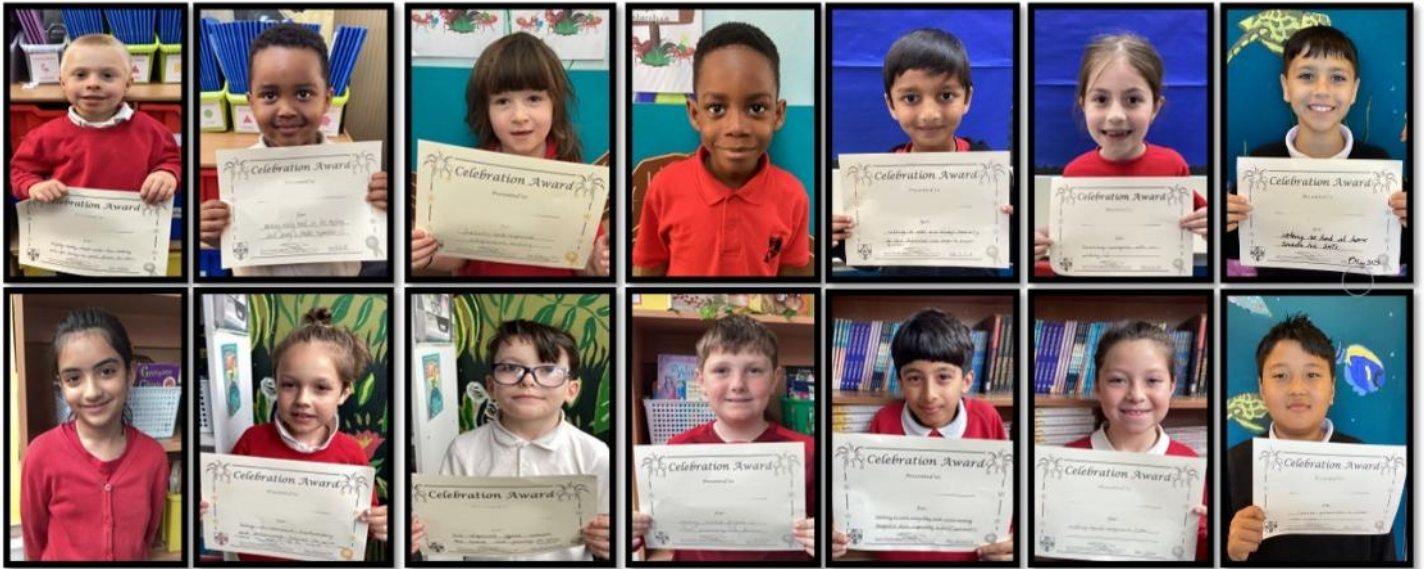
