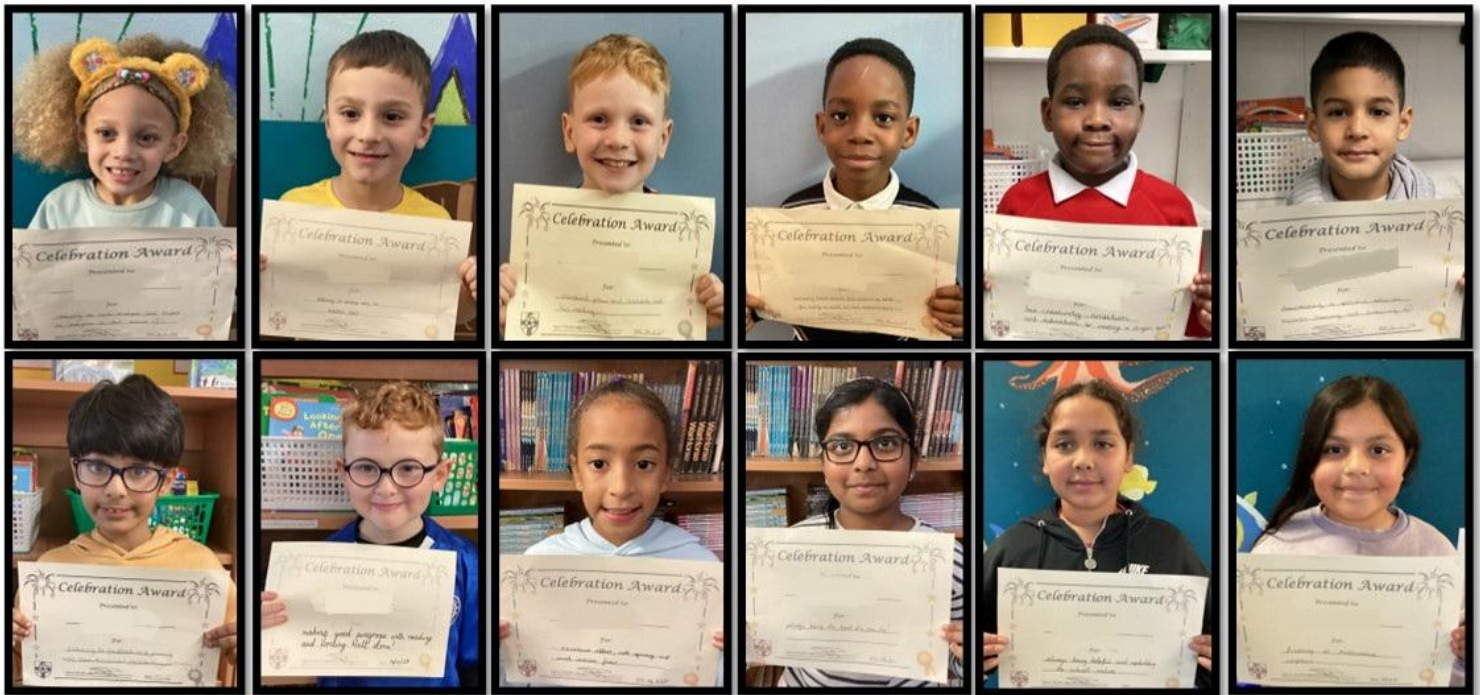

On **Friday 14th November** we supported 'BBC Children In Need' with a whole school non-uniform day as part of The Blue Sky Federation.

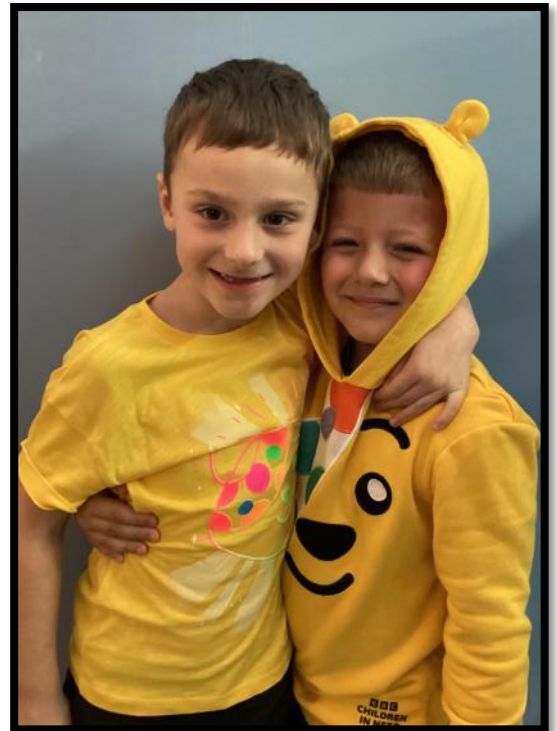

On **Wednesday 19th November**, 12 students from Year 6 children went to Long Meadow School for a writing workshop with author Colin R Parsons.

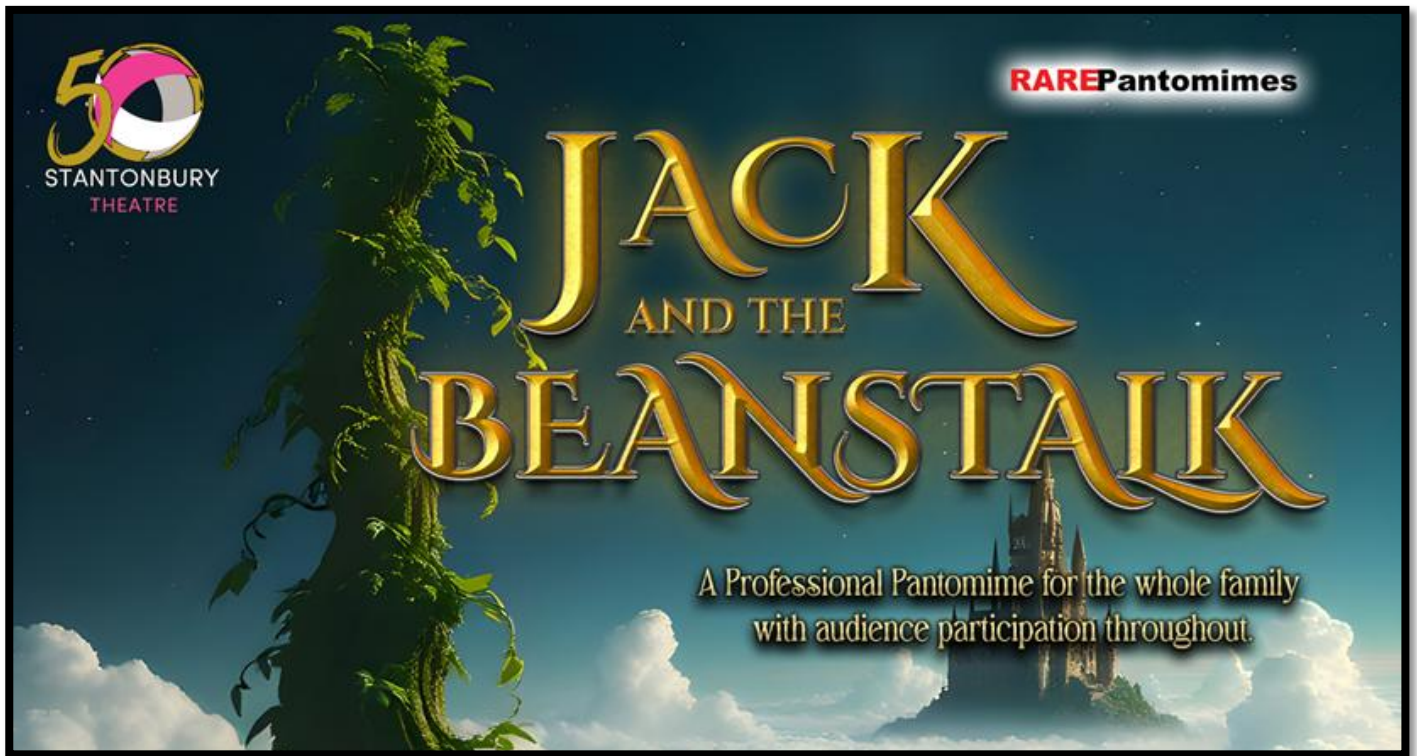


Pantomime Trip—Year 2/3/4/5/6...
