KS2 Upper




NAME IT, CLAIM IT!


YEAR 1

The new topic is **'Around The World With The Three Bears'** Immersion day is on **Thursday 15th April**. Children can come dressed as their favourite country.




YEAR 3


YEAR 4

A brief guide to... FIXED PENALTY NOTICE CHARGES FOR HOLIDAYS IN TERM-TIME

FIXED PENALTY NOTICE FOR HOLIDAYS IN TERM-TIME

Parents or carers can receive a FIXED PENALTY NOTICE (FPN) for taking their children out of school during term time for leisure or recreation.

- 1st Offence...** The FPN is issued for the first offence at £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days, and £160 if paid between days 22-28.
- 2nd Offence...** The second offence incurs a £160 fine per parent, per child, payable within 28 days.
- 3rd Offence...** The third offence results in no penalty notice being issued and the case may proceed to the Magistrates Court. Prosecution can lead to criminal records and fines of up to £2,500.

Parents are advised to complete a leave of absence request form at least four weeks before the leave and return it to the school's Headteacher for authorization. The Headteacher can only grant leave in exceptional circumstances.

For more information on penalty notices and to make payments, parents can contact the Attendance and Inclusion Team at the local council.
