Welcome back to Summer 2! Just a few weeks left of this academic year and we plan to fill it with as many experiences and memories as we can.

At Summerfield, we believe that learning extends far beyond the classroom. Educational trips and visits play a vital role in bringing learning to life, helping children to see, experience, and understand the world in meaningful and memorable ways. At the end of each academic year, the most memorable experience that our children recall almost always are the times they have been on trips out of school.

As a school, we try our very best to provide your child with as many low-cost, high-value experiences as possible. This may be through Immersion days in school, where children are fully engaged in themed learning, or through carefully planned educational experiences that enrich and support their studies.

Using our local area has also provided many valuable and engaging experiences. Visits to the library, sculpture park, and local parks have allowed pupils to explore learning in real-world contexts. These experiences have sparked curiosity, encouraged discussion, and helped children make meaningful connections between their learning and the world around them.

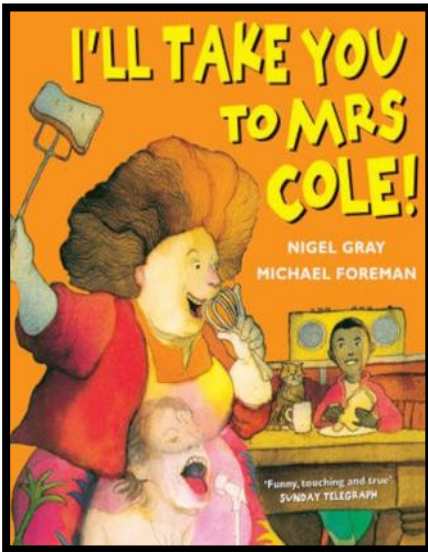
We also plan trips further afield which require a financial contribution from parents. These visits are carefully selected to enhance learning and provide experiences that cannot always be replicated in school. Whether it is a museum visit, a theatre trip, or outdoor learning experiences, these opportunities help pupils develop curiosity, independence, confidence, and a deeper understanding of the curriculum. They also create lasting memories and often spark a lifelong interest in new subjects and ideas.

## EYFS/KS1

In Year 2 this half term, our topic is "No Place Like Home", where we will be exploring homes and how they have changed over time.

In English, we will be retelling the story *I'll Take You to Mrs Cole* and developing our storytelling and writing skills.

In Maths, we will be learning about time, statistics, and position and direction, helping us to develop our problem-solving and reasoning skills.

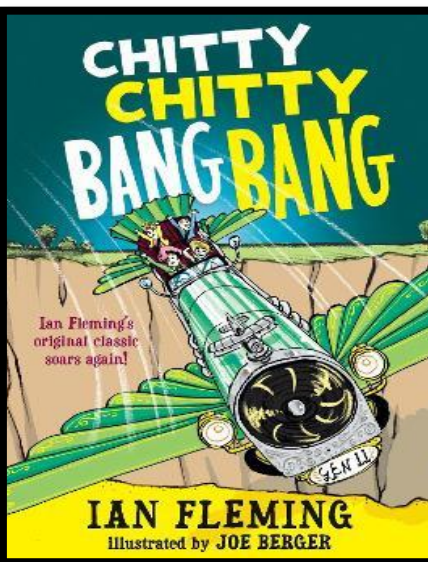
In History, we will investigate how homes have changed from the past to the present and compare different types of homes through time.

In Science, we will be growing sunflowers and bean plants and carrying out an exciting experiment to discover what plants need in order to grow and stay healthy.

In Design and Technology (DT), we will be designing and making our own pulleys to create a lift for a block of flats, exploring simple mechanisms and engineering concepts.

In Art, we will be studying repeated patterns and using our ideas to design and create our own wallpaper.

We are looking forward to a busy and exciting half term full of discovery!



## KS2 Lower

Year 4 will be exploring the exciting world of inventions and discoveries across a range of subjects. In History, the children will learn about significant inventions from the past and the inventors who helped shape our modern world. They will discover how new ideas and innovations have changed the way people live and work throughout history.

In Science, the children will learn about electricity and investigate the components needed to light up a circuit. They will also learn about the work of Michael Faraday, whose discoveries and inventions played a key role in our understanding of electricity.

In English, we will be reading and using the classic novel *Chitty Chitty Bang Bang* as inspiration for our writing. The children will create their own imaginative narratives, developing their creativity by inventing unique machines and gadgets while applying a range of descriptive and storytelling techniques.

In PE, the children will develop their fundamental games skills through a variety of activities using modified courts and small-sided games. This will improve their ball skills confidence.



## KS2 Upper

Year 6 recently enjoyed a fantastic walk to the Hub as part of their learning in preparation for their upcoming pop-up restaurant project. During the visit, pupils explored a variety of restaurant menus, giving them a real-life insight into how menus are designed and presented.

The children were excited to see the wide range of cuisines and styles on offer, sparking lots of discussion about ingredients, pricing and presentation. This experience has helped to inspire them as they begin planning their own menus and recipes for their pop-up restaurant.

We are looking forward to seeing their creativity come to life in the coming weeks!

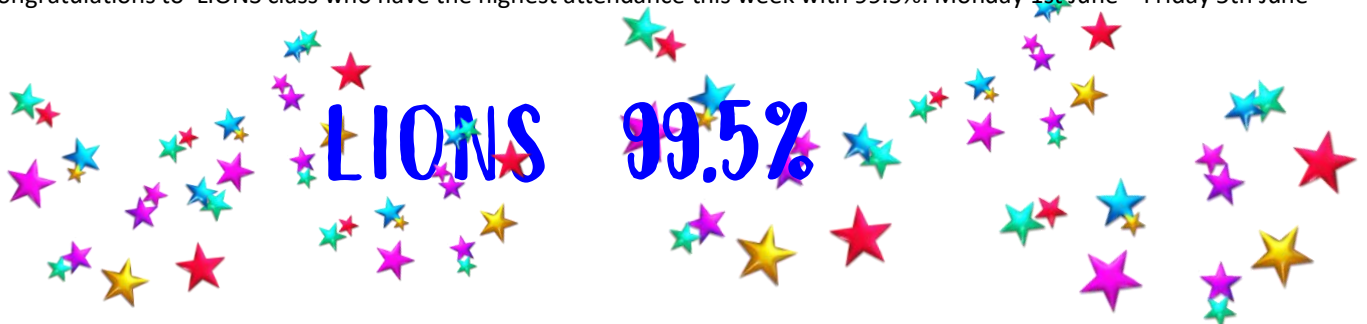

Year 3 celebrated getting 2000 green points per class this week by decorating and eating biscuits!

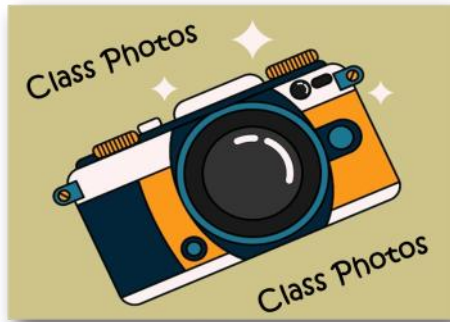
They looked as good as they tasted! Yummy!
