UNIVERSAL INFANT FREE SCHOOL MEALS:

Did you know that all children in EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 receive FREE school meals through the Government incentive, Universal Infant Free School Meals.

Your child can choose from a range of delicious hot and cold options including; vegetable curry, fish fingers, macaroni cheese, pesto pasta, chicken noodles, jacket potato with cheese and beans, cheese/tuna/ham roll.

Dolce provide meal choices on a 3 week rotation.



FREE SCHOOL MEALS - ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?:

If you earn under a certain threshold amount or are in receipt of certain benefits, you could be entitled to Free School Meals/Pupil Premium.

Briefly including:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance

SCHOOL TRIP LUNCHES:

Please be reminded that if your child is attending an all-day school trip, a packed lunch needs to be provided from home.

If your child receives Free School I Meals/PP, a packed lunch from Dolce will be provided for your child.



MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS:

Please can we encourage families to make GP Doctor and Dentist appointments outside of the school day, either **BEFORE** 08:45am or **AFTER** 3:15pm. Appointments during the school day are disruptive to your child's learning and to the other children in their class. We understand that emergency and hospital appointments need to be taken when given. Thank you for your co-operation.

BEFORE 08:45am or AFTER 3:15pm

LATENESS:

Please can we remind families that the school day starts at **08:45am**. If your child arrives after this time they are missing essential morning learning. If your child arrives after 9:00am they will be marked as **late**. If your child is marked late on more than 6 occasions in a 12 week period, a fixed penalty notice may be raised. Children who arrive after 9:15am will receive an unauthorised absence mark. Please make sure you arrive on time. Thank you.



School Attendance and Absence...

Did you know that Schools are no longer allowed to authorise requests for children to be taken out of school in term time unless there are "exceptional circumstances". The DfE states that anything to do with "relaxation and leisure" is not exceptional circumstances. This will include visiting relatives, or a holiday due to mental or physical illness issues unless supported by medical evidence.

You should apply to your child's school for authorisation for term time leave. However, if not approved by the Headteacher, fines can now be issued if there are 10 unauthorised sessions in 10 school weeks (as above) the time taken doesn't need to be consecutive as was previously the case.

If you take leave which is not authorised by the school, then the school is encouraged by the Department for Education, to refer the matter to the Local Authority who will issue a Fixed Penalty Notice. This is to ensure consistency across England and Wales.

Fixed Penalty Notices (FPN) are issued to each parent and per child. A FPN is £80 if paid within 21 days, and £160 if paid between 22 and 28 days. If the fine is not paid, you will be prosecuted in the magistrates' court and could receive a fine of up to £1000 (per parent) and a criminal record.

If a second period of leave is taken within 3 years (same parent/child) then the fine will start at £160 payable in 28 days. If there is a third offence in 3 years (same parent/child) then the matter will be prosecuted in the magistrate's court.

LEGAL ACTION





AUTHORISED



An absence for sickness for which the school has granted leave



Medical or dental appointments which unavoidably fall during school time.



Religious or Cultural observances



An absence due to a family emergency



Sporting events, music assessments and competitions (Approval is required)

UNAUTHORISED



Students who are absent from school without reason



Truancy before or during the school day



Arrival at the school after registration has closed. (after 9:00am)



Absence due to shopping, looking after other children or birthdays



Mild student illness

DID YOU KNOW?

Research shows that children who are in school most of the time do better on state tests. Studies also show that kids who are absent more often score lower on state tests.

Being late for school hurts a child's learning, too. A student who is 10 minutes late every day will miss 30 hours of instruction during the year.







